### SELECT NOTES

Some of you may have noticed that the classy granite sign at the Safety Complex was no longer looking so classy after the adhesive gave way on the portion that had the engraving and town seal. Unfortunately, it was not possible to repair the sign to its original appearance as any attempt to reattach that portion would either not adhere properly or had the potential of destroying the main stone. did find a solution, though. main stone has been engraved in large, simple letters "MADBURY POLICE-FIRE". Plans are to place the portion that decided to part company with the main stone near the entry to the building. When all is completed, we should have a happy ending to the saga of the stone.

The Board of Selectmen and the Oyster River Youth Association are in the process of finalizing a 20 year lease for Tibbetts Field that will allow ORYA to develop an additional playing field there that will be the same size as the existing field. Plans include irrigation of the fields, expansion of the parking area, and construction of a building to enclose the water tanks and provide storage. There will also be a small, separate parking area for use by people taking advantage of the exercise trail that is being planned by the Recreation Commission.

ServiceLink, an "aging and disability resource center," will be holding an application assistance event on Friday, June 6, from 9am to 12 noon at the Dover Welfare Office. The event will provide assistance in en-

rolling in two programs: LIS (Limited Income Subsidy Program), which provides extra help with Part D Medicare Drug Plans, and the Medicare Savings Program, which helps clients with their Medicare Part A & Part B premium, deductibles and copays. These programs are for low-income seniors who meet the financial criteria established by the federal government. If you think

you might qualify, please contact the town office at 742-5131 for additional information.

While most building permits are available through the Building Office, there are two permits that must be obtained from the office of the Selectmen. One is the driveway permit, which is required for all new driveway installations. There is a

## TOWN OFFICE NEWS

**DOVER RECYCLING CENTER** is open year round and available to all Madbury residents. The Center is currently open on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays from 8:30am to 3:30pm. Additional information can be accessed through the Community Services page of their website (www.ci.dover.nh.us). As the schedule sometimes changes, you are encouraged to check their website to verify days and times of operation. Permits can be picked up at the Center by showing some type of identification verifying you live in the Town of Madbury.

**MADBURY TRANSFER STATION** is usually open monthly on first and third Saturdays from 9:00am to 4:00pm and on second Wednesdays from 4:00pm to dusk. Transfer Station regulations can be located through the Transfer Station/Waste Collector link on the Madbury website at: www.townofmadbury.com.

**DOG LICENSES:** 2012 Dog Tags are now overdue. You are encouraged to license your dog prior to June 1 to avoid further penalties. A male or female dog license is \$9.00 and spayed or neutered dogs are \$6.50. Owners over 65 years old can register one dog for \$2.00. A current rabies certificate is required.

**SUPERVISORS OF THE CHECKLIST:** Supervisors will be available from 7:00-7:30pm on June 5 for residents wishing to change their party affiliation and from 7:00-7:30pm on September 4 for residents needing to register to vote at the State Primary in September. Supervisors will also be available for voter registration from 11:00-11:30am on October 27, prior to the General Election of November 6.

**TAX BILLS:** It is anticipated that tax bills will be mailed on May 24 and due by July 2, 2012.

**OFFICE CLOSINGS:** May 28 for Memorial Day, July 4th, and September 3 for Labor Day.

# Water Resources Board

The Water Resources Board has been collecting data on well water since the mid-1970's. The reason is two-fold: to collect and maintain data on the quality of water within the town, and to assist homeowners in determining the quality of their drinking water. The NH Department of Environmental Services and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) recommend the testing of private wells every 3-5 years.

In general, we are finding good water quality in Madbury, although occasionally an area of concern can arise. In those cases, the Board can point to guidance from experts, but decisions and actions are generally the responsibility of the well owner.

During the summer of 2012 the Board will offer testing for volatile organic compounds (VOC). VOC's are contained in a wide variety of industrial and residential products including fuel oils, gasoline, solvents, cleaners, paints, refrigerants and pesticides. Long-term exposure to VOCs may lead to impaired immune system function, may cause liver damage or may increase the risk of cancer. We last tested for VOC's in 1998 and 2000.

The Board is offering VOC testing using an EPA method 524.2 which tests for about 70 contaminants. The average cost of testing is \$130, but the Board is receiving a discount from the testing lab and subsidizing some of the cost. All residents can participate in the testing for \$45. If a well was tested in 1998 or 2000, and showed detectable but acceptable levels of a contaminant the cost will be \$25. If the well tested for levels above the drinking water standard the test will be at no cost. The Board has set aside a limited amount of funds from our budget for the testing, so there is a first come-first serve component.

If you have an interest in finding

out about the drinking water quality of your well, and wish to help the town expand its knowledge of water quality, please submit an indication of interest slip. Slips will be available at the Town Hall, Library, town website, and at Madbury Day. They can be returned by mail or in person to Town Hall, or dropped off at the library.

We will then contact you for permission and payment. In most cases, samples can be taken from an outside faucet (the preferred location). Generally, water will be run for about 5 minutes to clear the system before the sample is taken. After the lab analysis you will receive a copy of the results. The town will also have a copy of the results, and will only report in ways that individual results will not be identified. Please be aware, however, that we must comply with any specific request for information regarding this testing program because we are a public board.

# **Building Inspector**

# When do I need a Building Permit to do work on my house?

The answer, of course, depends on many factors, but this posting should help most people, most of the time, to decide whether they need to apply for a permit. The building code requires a permit for any new construction in or on the ground. Structures of less than 100 sq. ft. (10 x 10) are exempt from the requirement for a permit, but must nonetheless comply with the building code. Demolition of an existing structure also requires a permit. You do not need a permit if you replace windows or doors with like items. If you are changing the size and/or location of windows and doors, requiring changes to the structure of the building, you will need a permit. Nearly any extensive renovation requires a permit. Replacing an electrical outlet or fixture does not require a permit, but any additions or changes (including re-wiring) to the electrical wiring of the house requires a permit. Plumbing is similar to electrical in that you can change a fixture or toilet without a permit, but any additions or changes to the plumbing system of the building requires a permit. The installation of all (new or replacement) equipment operated on gas, including furnaces, fireplace inserts, pool/Jacuzzi heaters, water heaters and other appliances, requires a permit. Oil furnaces also require a permit which is issued by the Fire Chief. If you have questions about your need for a building permit which aren't answered here, please call me at Town Hall (603) 742-5131 and we'll figure it out.

Children will explore the physics behind how rockets work including Newton's Third Law, go through the Engineering Design Process to build rockets and reentry devices, explore wind resistance on a falling body, and learn about the challenges of traveling huge distances. Space is limited to 25 participants **per session** (adults come to the session with children age ten and under and are counted as part of the 25 total per session). Children over 10 work independently in the sessions. We will be offering two to three sessions depending on the number of people that sign-up.
